PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS/REPORT

Mrs. Grant welcomed everyone to the Board Meeting. She introduced the new Superintendent, Dr. Gina Villani, noting her past experience and her tireless efforts to acclimate herself to our district. She expressed the board's enthusiasm in having Dr. Villani lead our district and being a part of our community. She then formally welcomed Dr. Villani to our school district. She then gave a review of the negotiations between the Clinton Township Board of Education and the Clinton Township Teacher's Association. She stated that both parties have agreed on a Memorandum of Agreement which included salary guides and finalized language in the body of the contract. She noted that the Board of Education will vote to approve the contract at tonight's meeting. She then brought forth following resolution:
