Home Instruction

Only students designated for quarantine as per District procedures are eligible for the virtual instructional platform.

<u>Updated Information from the NJ Department of Health (DOH)</u>

- Continue to keep your child home when they are sick or have any symptoms and contact the school nurse for next steps.
- New quarantine criteria for close contacts from the NJ DOH will be implemented beginning Monday, January 31, 2022 for students based on the following:
 - ➤ Close contacts who **MEET** the criteria to guarantine include:
 - Persons ≥ 12 years old who completed a primary series of COVID-19 vaccine but have not received a recommended booster shot when eligible.
 - Persons who are not fully vaccinated (haven't completed a primary vaccine series).
- ❖ If an individual receives a COVID booster when eligible, they will be considered fully vaccinated at the time of receiving the booster and may not have to quarantine based on the criteria for close contacts. Visit the NJ DOH for more information about vaccines and booster eligibility.

- The new NJ DOH criteria indicates that individuals 12 and older must have a <u>booster when eligible</u> to be considered fully vaccinated and therefore, not meet the criteria to quarantine.
- ❖ The chart below outlines who needs to quarantine and for how long based on other factors. As always, every situation is unique. Please contact your school nurse to report any positive cases or exposures.

Criteria for Quarantines for Individuals that are identified as a close contact to someone who is COVID positive

Can return to school on day 6 with strict mask wearing.	The 5 day quarantine starts after the positive case's 5 day isolation period. Quarantine for 5 days. (Day 0 through Day 5 = 6 days + 5 days quarantine = 11 days total)	The 5 day quarantine starts after the positive case's 10 day infectious period. Quarantine for 5 days. (Day 0 through Day 10 =11 days + 5 days quarantine = 16 days total)
DOES NOT MEET the criteria to quarantine: • Persons ≥ 12 years old who completed a primary series of COVID-19 vaccine AND have received all recommended vaccine doses, including boosters and additional primary shots for some immunocompromised people. • Children 5-11 years old who completed the primary series of COVID-19 vaccine. • Persons who had confirmed COVID-19 within the last 90 days (positive viral test).	No Quarantine Can return to school. Should anyone become symptomatic please keep them home and notify your school nurse.	No Quarantine Can return to school. Recommend to isolate positive case at home, wear masks at home and monitor for symptoms. Should anyone become symptomatic please keep them home and notify your school nurse.		

As per the Hunterdon County Department of Health, current Hunterdon County data is as follows:

- Steady number of fatalities
- Steady decline in positive cases
- ❖ Decrease in daily cases dropped to over 100 from over 300 last week
- ◆ Decrease in daily county cases from 563 High in January to January 25 (45)
- Hospitalizations are decreasing but still a concern
- ❖ 26% positive from testing not including those utilizing home tests
- On February 1, children age 12 become eligible for booster
